MAIN RESULTS/OUTCOMES OF THE CONFERENCE

About 250 attendees, including educators, researchers, linguists, policy-makers, and experts, gathered to exchange ideas and experiences on the theme of "Balancing Acts: Harmony and Collaboration in Education." In accordance with the United Nations' 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), The conference featured 24 presentations from various



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educational institutions. The conference emphasized the importance of collaboration in developing innovative solutions to address the challenges faced in the education sector as

well as the importance of educational inclusivity.

THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CONFERENCE (SHOULD BE SENT TO MHE/ GENERAL DIRECTORATE OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT)

Based on the presentations and research shared at the VESAL 2024 Conference at Tishk International University, we suggest the following actions to improve higher education and research:

1. Improve Teacher Training

What to Do: Provide better training programs for teachers that focus on modern teaching methods and using technology in the classroom.

Why It's Important: Speakers at the conference highlighted that well-trained teachers are key to quality education. By improving teacher training, we can enhance how students learn, especially in English language classes.

2. Use Technology and New Teaching Methods

What to Do: Encourage the use of online learning tools, artificial intelligence, and innovative teaching methods like flipped classrooms to make learning more effective.

Why It's Important: Research showed that technology helps teachers and students communicate and work together better. New teaching methods can make lessons more engaging and personalized.

3. Make Education Accessible for All

What to Do: Ensure that schools and learning materials are designed so that all students, including those with disabilities, can participate fully.

Why It's Important: Currently, some students are left out because of barriers in buildings or teaching styles. Making education accessible ensures everyone has an equal opportunity to learn.

4. Support Students Learning English as a Foreign Language

What to Do: Offer additional resources and support to students who are learning English, such as confidence-building activities and better learning materials.

Why It's Important: Studies found that many English learners struggle with confidence and anxiety. Providing support can help them improve their language skills more effectively.

5. Collaborate with Other Institutions and Publish Research

What to Do: Partner with other universities and organizations to host future conferences at different locations, bringing in new ideas and participants. Also, make agreements with journals and publishers to help researchers publish their work.

Why It's Important: Working with others introduces fresh perspectives and expands the reach of events. Publishing research allows valuable findings to be shared widely, contributing to the advancement of knowledge.
